We have had no more success in locating files of this newspaper anywhere else in the world than did Serif Mardin, author of the book you cite, The Genesis of Young Ottoman Thought.

Dear Mrs. Fakhouri:

The questions in your letter of October 6 are not easily answered, and their difficulty accounts to some extent for the delay in this reply.

We do not know to what <u>Courrier d'Orient</u> refers. We have no such title in our collection. Is it a newspaper? A periodical? What are the dates involved? What is the subject matter? If we had more information about this reference, we might be able to give a more satisfactory response.

Clerbois Collection may mean different things to different agencies. To us it is simply the name given to an important collection assembled by Leon Clerbois and purchased by this library in 1935. It consists of approximately 40,000 items, 1789-1914 -- books, pamphlets, newspapers, periodicals -- from forty countries, chiefly France and Belgium, dealing largely with history and journalism.

Although no complete listing of serials in all languages published in the Ottoman Empire is known to us, you may find useful the following publication, which lists all Ottoman Turkish serials published through 1928, in the collection of the National Library in Ankara:

Ankara. Millî Kütüphane. Eski harfli Türkçe süreli yayınlar toplu katalogu. Ankara, Millî Kütüphane, 1962.

This work contains approximately 1800 entries providing titles, inclusive dates of publication, format, frequency and name of editor.
