Enders Wimbush tells that that you have most kindly expressed willingness to help to put the "final touches" to this Centre's Uzbek course.

He told me to get in touch with you at RFE/RL. I thought it might save time & trouble to have a talk about it on the phone, and cabled to you suggesting this. If you phone me here any weekday (but not Fridays) during office hours I shall probably be here, and if not you can leave a message telling me when to call you. Please reverse charges if you call.

I might be able to get over to Munich in August, but can't get away from the typrewriter this month, unfortunately.

As I see it, the task is simply to say the English headings of each chapter, and of each section—just so that the tape has its clear "signposts", and the students knows where he is as he plays the tape. (But, with the words of the vocabularies and the sentences of the Uzbek passages, no English is spoken, just Uzbek.) Then say the words, or the Uzbek passages etc, at normal speech speed. (These are the final two lessons.)

Enders says that some of the sentences sound a bit old-fashioned. It was

done over 25 years ago! If you feel a sentence could be put better, I think the think to do is, first, to say the sentence as in the written text, and then say in English, "or, better..." and then your updated version of it. Because it would involve too much messing around to alter the typed text. (We will explain this proceeding to the student.)

You, or anyone else who may help, must of course charge the Centre such fees as you feel appropriate for your work and time.
