as I promised.


Sponge cake. very fine.

and 6 dlhy flour. Mix yolks and sugar
very well after add the whites of the eggs
beaten stiff mix and place in a greased
tins.

Nuts-Ponlade.

6 eggs, 4 dlhy Zucker, sugar
6 dlhy sugar, 10 dlhy Mehl, flour
5 dlhy nuts

Mix yolks and sugar well after add
fine ground nuts and at last white stiff
snow. Place it in a large tin that you
can roll after if it is baked.

Crème. for Ponlade. 

15 dlhy butter
15 dlhy icing sugar
vanille treps and 1 egg
5 dlhy nuts

Beat butter, sugar
egg well, after
add ground
nuts a bit vanilla
& cognac.

42 dkg honey, half a tea-spoon cinnamon
half tea-spoon spice; a bit of cardamom grind

42 dkg brown flour (black)

12 dkg sugar

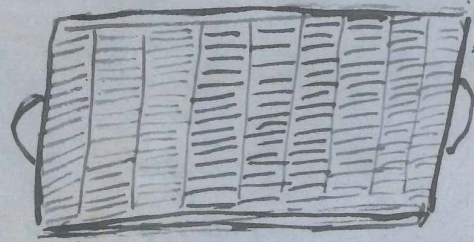
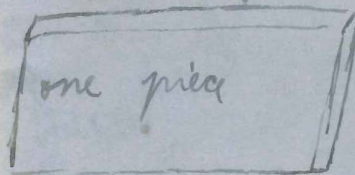
2 eggs

1 dkg potash dissolved in warm

water; 100 pieces of half mts, ^{10 dkg} arancini =
^{10 dkg} candied orange, shell and candied lemon
peels. From fruits, arancini and the others as
much you like.

One must melt the honey (not cook) and
mix all well together and put on a well
fat maked tin & plate; one hour slowly
to bake.

Heat dry cut in little pieces.
