Dear Dr. Riza,

Yesterday in looking through some papers at the apartment in New York City, to which we have just gone (this apartment is at 604 Riverside Drive, New York City), Mrs. Fisher and I came across some very interesting reminders in the way of letters and pictures of visits with you and your family either at Constantinople or at your lovely Jounieh. I cannot refrain from dropping you a brief note which we trust will find you and your family in the very best of health.

It is now almost a year since I came to the Institute of International Education and I have been enjoying my association in this work with Dr. Duggan very much indeed. During that time here in New York City it has been our good pleasure to see quite a number of friends of Constantinople and Beirut days. We have not as yet been able to see your son who I believe is still in the vicinity of New York, and we would be very glad if you would send him our address or forward his address to us so that we could see him sometime. Is your daughter also in this country?

We have been following with deep interest the events in the Arab world and particularly the new developments in relations between France and her mandated areas in Syria and the Lebanon. It is becoming increasingly clear to me that all territories which are held as colonies or crown possessions ought to be put under mandate control regardless of the country which holds the possessions. If it is a good plan to have some so-called colonial possessions under mandate, it is probably a good plan to have all under mandate. It seems to me also increasingly clear that the day of the old-fashioned and unfortunately too iniquitous imperialism of the nineteenth and early twentieth century is past and that the sooner Germany and Italy especially, realize this fact the better it will be for all parts of the world.
